What this means: One of our goals for 2023 was to move towards a balanced budget by limiting expenses and growing donations. We are on track do to this. While Q3 shows a deficit, projections suggest we will do better than budget. This is very good news but has come with some significant changes – not replacing outgoing staff being a major factor.

What this means: At the end of the 2022, we had \$139,491 in the building fund and \$85,285 in the operating account. We will use these funds to cover the outstanding \$152,838 in masonry project costs. To note, in addition to the masonry project, we have taken on several other significant but necessary building projects in 2023 (plastering and painting inside the church, lights on daily lawn exterior wall, fencing the vestry courtyard, etc.). Together these cost an additional \$35,000.

The takeaway: We have enough to cover these costs but will be diving deep into our reserves to do so. This was always the plan, and hopefully means we don't have too many other significant building

projects over the next few years as we build up a bit of a cushion. As is our norm, \$20,000 from the operating account will be moved into the building fund by the end of the 2023.
